DSA families are reminded that classes for middle school students will be in session on Friday, May 4th. Traditional middle schools in DPS will have an assessment day. However, since DSA is a 6-12 school our middle school students will report to school.

All students taking Advanced Placement Exams will report to the lobby outside of the Schomp Theater at 7:35 am on Wednesday, May 2nd and will walk to Johnson and Wales with Ms. Odom to complete the pre-bubble of their answer sheets in preparation for AP exams. AP exams will be administered from May 7th – May 18th.

This is a reminder that all students will receive a copy of their trial class schedule for the 2012-2013 school year next week. Along with this schedule they will also received a copy of instructions on how to adjust their schedule if a schedule change is needed. Students will have from the time they receive their schedules until noon on May 25, 2012 to make changes; this includes adding a student assist to their schedule. After this time period no changes to student schedules will be made. Students will **NOT** be permitted to change their schedules when they return to school next August. We are making every attempt to have class sizes balanced by the end of May. It is very important that you review the trial schedule with your student and follow the directions on the sheet attached to the schedule.

We are in need of your support in attaining another outstanding rating in the School Performance Frameworks by filling out and sending back the parent surveys that you should have received this week from your student. If you are happy with the opportunities and programs your child has at Denver School of the Arts, please, let the district know! Additionally, if you have concerns in certain areas, we need to hear your thoughts so we can improve on our services. The parent return rate of surveys impacts our rating, so it is crucial that Denver School of the Arts has a high return rate and high satisfaction rate. Send the survey back to school with your student and have them turn them into their major teacher. Your

completed survey needs to be returned in the sealed envelope by Friday, April 27th. The Arts Department that has the highest return rate will be awarded additional money in their instructional budgets for the 2012-2013 school year. You also have the option of mailing the survey by May 1st. If you received a survey that was not pre-bubbled with the school number, the school number for middle school is 425 and the school number for high school is 475.

Denver 2012 will showcase performances by host Cleo Parker Robinson Dance Ensemble, by students from the Denver School of the Arts, as well as by special guest companies Afriky Lolo, Giwayen Mata, and Capoeira Luanda from Bahia, Brazil. In addition, there will be an opening processional with drummers & dancers, workshops on Capoeira and Samba, an art exhibition, and DanceAfrica's one-of-a-kind cultural bazaar.
